The Human Trafficking Capacity Building Center is a coaching and development hub assisting organizations and tribes with: (1) building their capacity to aid victims of all forms of human trafficking, (2) navigating the broad range of resources available to support their missions, and (3) strengthening human trafficking service networks. We are—



VICTIM-CENTERED

The Center champions victim-centered services that create conditions of trust and respect to empower victims to reclaim their lives and move toward self-sufficiency and independence.

COACHES

We partner with organizations in a collaborative and creative process to build their capacity to serve all victims of human trafficking.

NAVIGATORS

We help organizations navigate the broad range of financial resources, service delivery, and provider networks available to support their work with victims of all forms of human trafficking.

NETWORKERS

We help increase the connectivity within a community, assisting local organizations with building their network to offer a more comprehensive response to the needs of all victims of human trafficking.

CULTURALLY AWARE

We work within American Indian and Alaska Native infrastructure to develop approaches that align with cultural values while honoring and respecting American Indian and Alaskan Native practices.

INCLUSIVE

We work with organizations and tribes to help them best serve all victims of human trafficking.

Funded by the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office for Victims of Crime, the Center is committed to working with organizations and tribes to effectively serve victims of all forms of human trafficking. There is no cost to organizations and tribes for the Center's service. The Center is supported through federal funding and intended to enhance organizational infrastructure, so communities can build sustainable and evidence-based, trauma-informed approaches to meet all human trafficking victims' needs.



The Center offers the following services—

- Expand awareness of OVC and other federal funding and programming to support human trafficking survivors.
- Provide peer-learning opportunities to share knowledge and experience in serving human trafficking victims.
- Develop partnerships to increase victim identification.
- Advise on how to enhance organizational capacity to effectively use federal and non-federal funds.
- Identify a range of potential funding streams to enhance or expand victim service delivery capabilities.
- Provide coaching and hands-on support with developing or revising policies and procedures and/or improving operations and management systems (e.g., client intake).
- Connect organizations to trauma-informed care training.
- Develop partnerships to increase victim identification and service delivery protocols for all victims, including males and LGBTQ.
- Recognize the culture complexities of American Indians and Alaska Natives in designing service delivery approaches.
- Help organizations build their own local network with community service providers to provide a more comprehensive response to victims' needs.
- Increase knowledge of the service needs of all victims of human trafficking.
