## FEDERAL FUNDING RESOURCES

Knowing where to look for human trafficking grant solicitations can save time and help an organization locate the one(s) best aligned with its services. (Note: all federal grant solicitations are public information.) While the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) manages the largest amount of federal funding for anti-trafficking programs in the United States, more than a dozen federal departments and offices offer grants to address human trafficking.

### *Finding Federal Human Trafficking Grants through Grants.gov*

As the single access point for more than 900 grant programs offered by 26 federal grant-making agencies, Grants.gov allows visitors to electronically find and apply for competitive grant opportunities. Visit [Grants.gov](https://www.grants.gov) and conduct a keyword search for "human trafficking" to identify grant opportunities from all federal agencies. Funding is available for work to provide victim services, build capacity, receive technical assistance, support criminal justice efforts, and develop task forces.
